of the 140th **Meeting** of the "Independent Arbitration Committee" at the FMLB on 8 September 2022

<u>Item 1</u>: Association of the Austrian Electrical and Electronics Industries (Correction of the Minutes of the 139th Meeting)

Due to a correction request from the Association of the Austrian Electrical and Electronics Industries to the original request ... the values in point 4) Types II-V had to be changed. The decision remains unchanged. Derived changes are highlighted in colour.

- 1) <u>Price Correction to Personnel Costs under the Collective Bargaining</u> <u>Agreement 2022</u>
- <u>Award</u>: For contracts with public-sector clients the Independent Arbitration Committee has set a **price correction factor** under the collective bargaining agreement for 2022 of **4.87** % for the **personnel cost** portion, with effect from **1 May 2022**.

Out of it result the following increasing percentages:

Personnel cost portion (%)	<u>Increase (%)</u>
over 10 – 15	0.61
over 15 – 20	0.85
over 20 – 25	1.10
over 25 – 30	1.34
over 30 – 35	1.58
over 35 – 40	1.83
over 40 – 45	2.07

If the portion of personnel costs exceeds 45%, the "Increase (%)" shall be determined in continuation of the classification of the table above (e.g. for a personnel cost share "over 45 - 50" % : factor x 0.475)

2) <u>Provision for the Wage Cost Increase of 1 May 2022</u>

- Award: For contracts with public-sector clients the Independent Arbitration Committee has stated a cost correction to wage cost increases under the collective bargaining agreement for 2022 of 4.87 %, with effect from 1 May 2022 concerning orders subject to price conversion under ÖNORM B 2111.
 - To current contracts with variable prices concluded before 1 May 2000 in accordance with the provisions of ÖNORM B 2111 (version 1.1.1992) for all services provided on or after 1 May 2022 a reduction factor of 0.89 shall apply. Thereby an increase of the "wage" portion by 4.33 % is set.
 - To all contracts concluded on or after 1 May 2000 in accordance with the provisions of ÖNORM B 2111 (version 1.5.2000 and 1.5.2007 respectively) a reduction factor of 0.98 shall apply. Thereby an increase of the "wage" portion by 4.77 % is set.

If there are compensation payments by the state to cushion high price increases (especially for energy), these must be taken into account accordingly in the calculations.

The threshold value under ÖNORM B 2111 shall apply.

This recommendation shall apply to construction contracts based on provisions governing price conversions which differ from ÖNORM B 2111, insofar as the parties to the contract have agreed that they shall apply.

3) <u>Increase in Assembly Charge Rates</u>

<u>Award</u>: For contracts with public-sector clients the Independent Arbitration Committee has stated an increase of the **assembly charge rates by 4.87** % with effect from **1 May 2022**.

- 4) <u>Prolongation of Amended EEI Price Escalation Formula in the</u> <u>Telecommunications Sector</u>
- <u>Award</u>: The Independent Arbitration Committee has found the amended EEI price escalation formula to be suitable for a **period of one year from 1 May 2022.** The Committee acknowledges the resultant values:

Type 1 = Pure Software Services:	4.26	
Type 2 = Electronic Devices (single devices, modules):	<mark>6.49</mark>	
Type 3 = Communication Technology:	<mark>5.87</mark>	
Type 4 = Electronic Systems with Predominant Software Components		
(facilities or systems not running without software):	<mark>5.87</mark>	
Type 5 = Functional Price Modules:	<mark>5.69</mark>
